## **DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE**

Week 15

Confidence, Conviction and Communion ... by Billy

## **READ:** ACTS 4:13-22

- **CONFIDENCE**. It is clear from the start that their confidence was derived from God and not themselves. (*Acts 4:8*)
- Education stimulates the mind and experience inspires practical solutions but the Holy Spirit changes the heart.
- These men had not learned the Rabbinic tradition and were uneducated. (v.13) Confidence in God's power was so crucial to the early church that they gathered to pray for a continuous supply. (Acts 4:29)
- 'They didn't pray for the defeat of the evil forces or even for their own safety but rather for boldness and for the hand of God to heal and perform signs and wonders.' (Gempf)
- Later the apostle Paul asked the Ephesian church to pray for him that he would preach the word with such confidence. (*Eph.6:19*)
- **CONVICTION.** Such confidence in God led to conviction.
- They could not remain as silent witnesses but had "to speak of those things which they had both seen and heard." (v.20)
- There is a duty of worship and proclamation on the churches part which is prior to the rights of the State.
- The day when this is directly forbidden is the day when the church must stand up and resist.
- **COMMUNION.** 23-31 It all started with the prayer meeting.
- If we are not willing to pray for the fullness of the Holy Spirit there will be little confidence or conviction in our life.
