DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE

Keeping our Focus on the Things Above ... By Billy-

READ: 1 PETER 1: 1-16

- Shose who are truly born again by the Spirit of God have a deep sense that they are 'resident aliens' in this world. (*V.1*)
- The values and the joys of this present culture hold little or no appeal because we belong to another country and wait for a salvation that is yet to be revealed.
- We can see from verse two that the three persons of the Trinity are the architects of this wonderful salvation.
 - Chosen according to the foreknowledge of the Father
 - · Sanctified by the Holy Spirit to obey Jesus Christ
 - Washed/sprinkled by the blood of the Lamb of God.
- We are not born again to hope for a transformation of society in which Christians can happily co-exist with the world.
- Nor is our hope confined to the experience of God's goodness in this life only. (1 Cor.15:19)
- We are born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. (v.3)
- We hope for an inheritance which is imperishable and undefiled and will not fade away, which is reserved in heaven. (*v.4*)
- Many will be frantically reserving seats in restaurants in the coming weeks, understandably considering the long weeks of lock down.
- It is not for us though to book a place in Heaven. It is God Himself who reserves the place on our behalf. (*John 14:2*)
- In the meantime, in the here and now we are daily protected by the power of God as we hear and believe His word. (*v*.5)
- Our reason to be glad and rejoice is constant despite various trials.
- This constant, everlasting and unfading hope ought to fill us with a deep sense of joy. (v.6)

DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE

Week 48

- It is these very trials that prove that faith is genuine. (v.7)
- This joy is inexpressible and full of glory because even though we cannot physically see Jesus, we are persuaded of His love for us.
- Now let us turn to verse 13. "Therefore prepare your minds for action, keep sober in spirit, fix your hope completely on the grace to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ."
- There is herein a threefold exhortation. Firstly, prepare your minds for action.
- Gird up the loins of your mind (*KJV*). The picture is of a man having to gather up his long garment in order to run or to work unhindered.
- Don't you find that you trip up over your thoughts? In other words, they become distracting and discouraging causing a real hindrance.
- During the past week of being unwell I experienced this sense of spiritual concentration.
- We are often made to realize how much the battle is for the mind.
- Focus on the eternal realities will protect our minds from wandering worries. (*Eph.6:14*) having girded your loins with truth.
- Keep sober (in spirit) In order to be prepared for action (prayer, witness, praise, service) we have to keep a sober attitude.
- Becoming drunk on the pleasures of this world will leave us floored when it comes to the day of battle.
- Being intoxicated with the values of this culture will lull into a deep spiritual sleep. (I Thess.5:6, 1 Pet.4:7, 1 Pet.5:8)
- Fix your hope Spiritual focus needs constant readjustment.
- Hope for an outcome in provision, in ministry, in relationships may be dashed and disappointed.
- It is so easy for the saint who is struggling with grief or disillusionment to lose sight of the bigger picture.
- The grace of God comes to us with the dawning of each new day.
- But what grace will be revealed at the return of our Lord and Saviour? Who can begin to imagine?
