DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE

Memorizing God's Deeds ... by Billy

- The human mind is such an intricate creation and has proven its capabilities in many spheres of life. Even more incredibly mysterious is the human memory.
 - Why is it that some things are called to mind and not others?
 - Is there such a thing as selective memory or is it that we just remember the things that we prioritize most?
 - What is it that causes forgetfulness?
 - How does memory function in the spiritual realm?
- As we come to the closing of another year let's take a brief look at how memory can be used for the glory of God.
- When we are inclined to pray there are of course many distracting thoughts, but the worst are those of past failure in spiritual matters.
- Memory in this case can be very damaging, hindering spiritual progress if such reflections are not dealt with carefully.
- We are often reminded of our reluctance to pray, our insensitivity to the needs of others, our complaining attitude or our impatience, to name but a few vices.
- Let me also add failure to take responsibility for our actions, laziness in spiritual disciplines and concern for personal status.
- This is the memory that makes us feel ashamed but the feeling of shame can proceed in either a negative or positive course.
- Paul affirmed the church at Corinth for their positive response to feeling ashamed because it led to the action of repentance. (2 Cor.7:9-11)
- Peter was walking in his weary journey of denial of Jesus when he heard the cock crow- then he remembered the word of the Lord.
- The Holy Spirit is given to us in order that He might bring all things that Jesus taught to our remembrance. (John 14:26); see John 2:22
- By God's grace there is forgiveness for all of these sins so that we can begin again to walk in the Spirit and not fulfil the desires of the flesh.
- In this way our memory stirs us to action to do the right thing for the glory of God. (*Rev.2:5* and 3:3) Be wary of feeling overwhelmed by guilt and shame to the point of stagnation. This comes from the accuser of the brethren.
- Memory also works toward praise of God's great deeds. We could be sitting in a traffic jam, having a sleepless night or be overwhelmed with our workload and out of the blue our memory is stirred by the Spirit of God.
